→ Trust God & Rejoice in Hope

Q1. Why does God allow his people to do evil?

1:2-4 – How long, O Lord, must I call for help, but you do not listen? Or cry out to you "violence!" but you do not listen? ... Why do you tolerate wrong? ...
Justice is perverted...

A1. 1:5-11 – I am Sovereign, I will raise up Babylon to bring judgement and retribution upon Israel...



Q2. 1:12-2:1 Why does God, righteous & just & pure, allow an unrighteous nation to punish his people? Why is God silent when the wicked swallow up those more righteous than they are?

A2(a) 2:2-5 The revelation awaits an appointed time,

all will be resolved at the end...
Wait patiently for God to bring about the ultimate solution in his own time.
The righteous will live by faith...

A2(b) The Righteous will live by Faith. [Greek: "Faith" = "Faithfulness"]

A2(c) Also God speaks of five WOES & their Consequences:

W1+2+3. Woe to him who becomes wealthy & builds his empire by extortion, dishonesty, destroying others, plotting their ruin, and bloodshed and crime... → He will be plundered, his life will be forfeited, he has exhausted himself for nothing.

W4. Woe to him who gets his neighbour drunk so he may gaze on their nakedness... → He will be exposed and shamed, he will be disgraced and terrified.

W5. Woe to him who trusts the idols he has made, and turns to idols for guidance... → God waits to be found!



A2(d) The earth will be filled with knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea...

 \rightarrow 2:14

A2(e) The Lord is in his holy temple, let all the earth be silent before him...

 \rightarrow 2:20
